This week Harris County Precinct 3 held a Town Hall at Bayland Park to address Crime and Safety. The panel included Precinct 3 community leaders - including Crime Stoppers of Houston Andy Kahan, Pastor Willie Davis and Houston City Councilman Edward Pollard - along with Harris Co. Constable Ted Heap, Constable Mark Herman and Commissioner Ramsey. "With over 400 murders in the region last year, including almost 20% committed by violent defendants out on bond, it's time to hear from those directly affected. Families are concerned and want to know what can be done to make our communities safer," said Commissioner Ramsey. I could not help but feel guilty and oddly isolated with Sharpstown's crime having taken such a different direction in 2020. I did voice that low level offenders that are caught breaking into our cars at night and porch pirate offenders are not even considered criminals anymore when HPD cannot get the District Attorney's office to take the case. They are released and return right back to what they were doing. This is not right. That means it is still up to us, as masters of our castles to remain vigilant and on guard! Keep those lights on and those valuables OUT OF SIGHT. We must be doing something right.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME TYPES

Robbery — the taking of money or goods in the possession of another, from his or her person or immediate presence, by force or intimidation.

Burglary — (breaking and entering) an unlawful entry into a building for the purposes of committing an offence. Usually that offence is theft.

Theft — the act of stealing; the wrongful taking and carrying away of the personal goods or property of another; larceny. Examples include ransacking unlocked cars, taking property out of open garage doors, taking a purse off a front seat of an unlocked car, taking a mower out of the back of a pickup truck.

Aggravated Assault — an attempt to cause serious bodily injury purposely.

Property Crime — destruction, damage, vandalism

Rape — unlawful sexual activity carried out against the will of a male, female, or person under age, or incapable of consent.



LOOKING FOR HPD IN ALL THE RIGHT PLACES





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DISTRICT J COMMUNICATION PORTAL GOES LIVE

On December 14 the District J online portal was unveiled by Council member Edward Pollard, his staff, and members of the Patrol Task Team.

The portal is designed to allow District J residents to report quality-of-life violations which will be relayed by the Task Team to HPD's Differential Response Team (DRT). DRT officers are extensively trained in addressing this type of issue. Typical concerns include illegal trash dumping, aggressive panhandling, homeless encampments and similar problems.

The system is NOT a substitute for the City's 311 system, but rather is designed to work in conjunction with it. Of course, emergencies should be reported to 911.

DISTRICT J INTRODUCES HOT TEAM ONE (ON COVER)

The HOT Team is designed to offer supplemental services in addition to the Solid Waste Department. They will be able to assist in the following areas for now:

- Pick up scattered debris
- Heavy Trash (mattresses, tires, furniture, appliances...etc., but not chemicals, roofing, shingles, brick, plaster, concrete...etc.)
- Tree Waste
- Illegal Dumping
- Specific Landscaping

The 3-member team of Supervisor Kevin Kebede and associates J.B. Sithole and Raymond Tucker, will work directly with the District J office to address specific requests submitted via 311. Residents seeking help from the HOT Team should first report the issue to 311, obtain a 311 service request number, and then email District J Constituent Services Director David Alexander Brizuela at David. Brizuela@houstontx.gov. No requests can be accepted without a 311 service request number. The following is a breakdown of the District:

•1st Thursday: Sharpstown

•2nd Thursday: St. George, Gulfton, and Richmond Plaza South

• 3rd Thursday: Braeburn

•4th Thursday: Alief/Westwood

MEMORIAL HERMANN LIFE FLIGHT LAUNCHES K-9 AIR AMBULANCE SERVICE

Memorial Hermann Life Flight has launched a pioneering program, K9-Casualty Care Course and Transportation Service. The program provides K9 handlers with emergency care training, and a specialized first aid kit donated by We Ride to Provide, an organization honoring fallen police dogs.

COMMUNITY HAPPENINGS

Law enforcement K9s in need of critical medical care who are within Life Flight's 150-mile radius, will be transported to one of three veterinary hospitals: Texas A&M University, VERGI 24/7 Animal Emergency, or Westbury Animal Hospital.

The Life Flight Team conducts three to five training classes each month to serve the estimated 200 police canines in the Greater Houston area



DON'T MURDER THE MYRTLES!

It's already begun—the season when many landscape crews and homeowners are "pruning" their crape myrtles. However, if you're topping your trees, it's commonly known as "crape murder." Crape myrtles are a low maintenance plant, and if you have the correct variety for your space, they need minimal pruning.

Why prune any tree? We prune trees to 1) reduce risk, 2) maintain or improve the health and structure, 3) improve aesthetics, or 4) satisfy a specific need. Topping a tree does none of these things. In fact, constant topping makes the tree more susceptible to pests and disease, and if your need is to keep it a certain size, you have the wrong variety for that space. Additionally, the new growth is softer and frequently unable to hold the flower heads upright, resulting in bending or breaking branches.

If you must prune, remove damaged or weak branches; remove limbs that may affect pedestrians, clearance, or visibility; and remove crossing branches and ones that grow towards the center of the canopy (this creates better air flow).

There are more than 100 varieties of crape myrtles, ranging in size from 3 to 35 feet at maturity, so there's something for everyone.

Garbage and Yard Waste Collection

GARBAGE COLLECTION

- City-provided containers must be placed at the curb between 6 p.m. the day before and 7 a.m. on the scheduled collection day.
- Place container on the curb facing the street with the handle facing the house.
- Containers must be accessible and not blocked by obstacles, including parked cars, trees, mailboxes, fencing, etc. Blocked containers will not be emptied.
- Leave at least a three (3) feet space between garbage and recycling container to allow our trucks to safely operate.
- Remove containers from the curb line and/ or public view by 10:00 p.m. on the day of collection and stored in a secure location.

Do NOT put the following in your BLACK GARBAGE container: Household chemicals, computer equipment, yard trimmings, hot ash/coal, dead animals and construction/ demolition remodeling debris.

*Chemicals and hot ashes cause truck fires.

YARD WASTE

Yard waste is grass clippings, leaves and small branches. It must be placed in Cityapproved compostable bags to be collected. The City-approved compostable bags may be purchased at local grocery or hardware stores; be sure to look for the City Logo on the box. Yard waste is collected weekly on the same day as your garbage. Place the bags at least 3 feet from your garbage cart. Filled bags must weigh less than 50 pounds. Bundle small branches less than 4-feet in length and smaller than 18-inches in diameter and place next to the bags for collection. Yard waste mixed with trash, paper, plastic or any other type of waste will not be collected. Work performed by a contractor such as a yard service company must be removed by the contractor.

Extra Capacity Collection Fee

ADD-A-CAN

This program provides residents with the opportunity of having a second or third garbage can serviced for a fee. The fee will be added to your monthly water bill upon request of the service. Call 3-1-1 to enroll in Add-A-Can.

TAGS FOR BAGS

Extra bags of garbage are collected only if they have a special tag attached. The "Tags for Bags" program allows residents the convenience of purchasing "tags" instead of additional cans if they require extra service occasionally. These tags may be purchased at Fiesta, HEB, Sellers Bros. and participating Kroger stores. Residents may also download an order form at houstonsolidwaste.org and send the completed form and payment through the mail. Yard waste bags do not require tags.

RECYCLING THE RIGHT WAY

The City of Houston publishes a trash and recycling collection schedule but there are circumstances that often alter this schedule. Leave your container out and the next day is usually catch up day. If in doubt, call 311 or Scott at the SCA office for information. Here's a quick refresher on what to place in your GREEN curbside recycling bin and what goes in the black curbside trash container. Put these items in your GREEN Bin (make sure you empty and rinse plastic, metal, glass and coated containers).









METAL AND CANS PLASTICS #1-5

CARDBOARD & CARTONS

PAPER & NEWSPAPER

METAL and CANS:

Aluminum and Tin Cans (rinsed drained)

PLASTICS:

Plastic Containers #1 - 5 and 7 (rinsed drained)

CARDBOARD and CARTONS:

Carton - Cardboard boxes and cartons from items such as milk, juice, soup, crackers, cream, beans, water, broth, wine, etc.

Paper, Newspaper, Catalogs, Magazines and Phone Books



GLASS:

Effective immediately, glass is accepted in the green curbside recycling bin.

Please don't put dirty paper (greasy pizza boxes), large plastic items like old toys, or plastic bags in the green bin!

These items clog the machinery used to process recyclables resulting in delays and expense.
