





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE





Even though 2021 is still well below 2020's reported crime, June saw an uptick of 15%.

Some observations:

- 72% of our criminal activity happens between 6pm and 7am.
- 19% of our criminal activity happens on a weekend.
- •48% of our criminal activity occurs in Terrace 3.
- •72% of our criminal activity is auto theft or theft of property from inside vehicles.



DEFINITIONS OF CRIME TYPES

Robbery — the taking of money or goods in the possession of another, from his or her person or immediate presence, by force or intimidation.

Burglary — (breaking and entering) an unlawful entry into a building for the purposes of committing an offence. Usually that offence is theft.

Theft — the act of stealing; the wrongful taking and carrying away of the personal goods or property of another; larceny. Examples include ransacking unlocked cars, taking property out of open garage doors, taking a purse off a front seat of an unlocked car, taking a mower out of the back of a pickup truck.

Aggravated Assault — an attempt to cause serious bodily injury purposely.

Property Crime — destruction, damage, vandalism

Rape — unlawful sexual activity carried out against the will of a male, female, or person under age, or incapable of consent.

any fears you might have out of your mind. SEAL is patrolling ALL of Sharpstown DAILY.

STORM DRAIN PROBLEMS

If you have a storm drain in front of your house, please check to see if it has any debris. It doesn't matter whether it is leaves, pine needles, or trash--pick it up and throw it away. Don't let it flow into the storm drain and become part of a bigger problem.



DO YOU KNOW YOUR DEED RESTRICTIONS?

Remodeling your home? Adding On? Do you know your deed restrictions? Did you know that the Sharpstown Civic Association can look over your proposed plans for free before you start construction? We want to avoid deed restriction violations before they happen. Did you know that we have a 25 foot rear setback for the main structure? Did you know that there is a minimum percentage of brick that must be on your home? Did you know that you can't build in front of your building line? We want to help you! We want you to find out about possible violations before it costs you money and time. Several homeowners in the past couple years have had to tear down and/or modify their construction due to deed restriction violations. The City of Houston does not review deed restrictions when issuing permits. They require a signed affidavit acknowledging that the plans comply with your deed restrictions. This holds YOU, the homeowner. accountable for knowing and complying with your deed restrictions. We are here to help you. Call 713-789-2311 and explain what you want to do and Scott will help you navigate the process. All deed restrictions are available online at Sharpstown Civic.org

MOSQUITO PREVENTION

Weekly mosquito spraying began April 1st. This happens after dusk and will continue through September. You can help by eliminating standing water around your yards where the critters live.





DEED RESTRICTIONS UPDATE



Many residents have been asking about the DR update and when we will be taking signatures for approval. Covid has affected this process as well, but the Board is working hard on some final adjustments to the language and we plan on presenting to the residents for approval later this year.

- The proposed update (and several translations) will be available on our website soon.
- The proposed annual dues are lower than the current dues many of you already pay.
- The Board has REMOVED foreclosure as an option for non-payment of assessments.
- Approval of this update will provide for increased safety and better tools to address the run-down properties in Sharpstown.

Mays attended the University of Houston for her undergraduate degree in Interdisciplinary Studies and Grand Canyon University with a master's in Education Administration.




NEFF EARLY LEARNING CENTER AND PARTNERS

What does a school by the name of Neff Early Learning Center, its former principal Santrice Jones, Ms. M. Herrera, the teachers, the other staff personnel and our precious students do, while under the virus crisis? We become stronger in our partnerships. It is said that when a partnership has a barrier in front of their goals or their dreams, it is a test. Neff Early Learning Center passed the test by keeping the students safe, healthy and being taught what they should learn.

One of the partners for N.E.L.C. is the Rotary Club of Sharpstown. Sharpstown Rotary and volunteers have been dedicated since 2013. All of the members are unusually dedicated to Neff, including the past president, Karen Blakeman, and the current president, Peter Gascoyne.

Team First Book Houston.org and the Rotary Club work together. The huge project is that Sharpstown raises money for books for our immigrant children and others. The Rotary raises money for not only their club but also from the Rotary Foundation. After the money is



students books on their "present reading level". What is interesting is that the students starting at 4 years of age speak Spanish and ultimately English.

The students say the following every day. It's called "My Promise". Every morning and evening after brushing their teeth, they put their right hand over their heart and look in the mirror and say out loud "My Promise", "I am smart, I am important, I am loved, I read to others and I teach others to read, I promise".

The reading levels are ascertained by the teachers and given to those who order the book from First Book. Volunteers from Houston community-wide have been Charlie Davis, NFL Alumni Houston President, who loves distributing the books and talking to children. Bill Palko, past District Governor of Rotary District 5890, was so impressed by the children's excitement and dedication.

Also, during many of these book distributions, we produced films with the Jack J. Valenti School of Communications at the University of Houston. Then we entered them in the World/Fest International Film Competition. We have won several REMI Awards, whose purpose is to inspire and encourage others to help children in need. At the last World/Fest Awards Gala before the virus, there were 74 countries represented.

Our partnership also includes Channel 13 ABC, and DISNEY. DISNEY has given Neff incredibly beautiful hard-back books. By repeating "My Promise", the children have been teaching their parents and grandparents to speak and read in English. The results are that their parents and grandparents are able to get better-paying jobs. Some of our students have been able to raise their reading levels 2 or 3 grades above their present grade level. Samica Knight and her cameraman from Channel 13 have covered the book distribution.

Sharpstown Rotary, including Jon King, who is a part of the Rotary Club of Sharpstown, is a member of Rotary District 5890. The past District Governor, Scott Rainey, the present District Governor, E. Michelle Bohreer, volunteers, Team First Book Houston, First Book in Washington DC, Channel 13 ABC, and DISNEY want you to know we are dedicated to our children. As you pass by the children at Neff Early Learning Center, be proud of them and everyone involved.

Sharpstown is teaching and inspiring other groups. Sharpstown, you ALL are becoming an inspiration, encouraging others about what can be done. To everyone involved who helps our children to become the people they are meant to be, Thank You. With joy in our hearts, we know that we are overcoming our challenges and that we will be better. Thank you, thank you, and thank you.



RECYCLING THE RIGHT WAY

The City of Houston publishes a trash and recycling collection schedule but there are circumstances that often alter this schedule. Leave your container out and the next day is usually catch up day. If in doubt, call 311 or Scott at the SCA office for information. Here's a quick refresher on what to place in your GREEN curbside recycling bin and what goes in the black curbside trash container. Put these items in your GREEN Bin (make sure you empty and rinse plastic, metal, glass and coated containers).

CARDBOARD &

CARTONS





NEWSPAPER

METAL and CANS:

Aluminum and Tin Cans (rinsed drained)

METAL AND CANS PLASTICS #1-5

PLASTICS:

Plastic Containers #1 - 5 and 7 (rinsed drained)

CARDBOARD and CARTONS:

Carton - Cardboard boxes and cartons from items such as milk, juice, soup, crackers, cream, beans, water, broth, wine, etc.

PAPER:

Paper, Newspaper, Catalogs, Magazines and Phone Books



GLASS:

Effective immediately, glass is accepted in the green curbside recycling bin.

Please don't put dirty paper (greasy pizza boxes), large plastic items like old toys, or plastic bags in the green bin!

These items clog the machinery used to process recyclables resulting in delays and expense.


Section 1 & 2 - Heavy Trash on Tuesday (second Tuesday of every month)

Section 3, 5, CCT1, CCT2, CCT3, Estates E&W - Heavy Trash on Monday (second Monday of every month)

Yard Waste or Grass Clippings are picked up on Wednesdays.

You may place waste at the curb no earlier than 6:00 pm on the Friday prior to collection.

TRASH FACTS



How to set out your garbage and recycling:

- · City-provided containers must be placed at the curb between 6 p.m. the day before and 7 a.m. on the scheduled collection day.
- Container must face the street with handle facing house.
- Containers must be accessible and not blocked by obstacles, including parked cars, trees, mailboxes, fencing etc. Blocked containers will not be emptied.
- · Leave at least a 3ft space between garbage and recycling container. This allows the truck to operate safely.
- Containers must be removed from the curb line and/or public view by 10:00 p.m. on the day of collection and stored in a secure location.
