Looking for HPD in All the Right Places



Need a copy of an accident report? Want to talk to an officer about a problem in your area? You see something suspicious and want to let law enforcement know about it? In Sharpstown, you won't have to go very far. Our community is served by two HPD substations, South Gessner and Midwest, and two HPD storefronts, Gulfton and Ranchester. The officers located at these facilities are there to help you in any way they can, so give them a call or a visit if you need assistance.

When to Call 911:

(Generally Accepted Situations) **Medical Emergencies:**

- Excessive bleeding
- Loss of consciousness
- Signs of stroke/cardiac event
- Seizure
- Severe difficulty breathing
- Choking
- Drug overdose
- Life or limb-threatening conditions
- Severe burns
- Poisoning

Situations + Crimes in Progress:

- Fire or smoke, home/building/business/car/wildfire Shooting
- Assault in progress
- Drowning
- Home invasion, burglary/robbery
- Incident with a deadly weapon
- Serious car accidents
- When moving the victim could cause further injury

When **NOT** to Call 911:

Calling 911 as a joke or without a real emergency is a crime. Avoid calling for:

- Tree branches blocking the road!
- Property damage
- Vehicle break-in
- Burglary when the villain has fled
- Car accidents with no injuries
- Minor illness or injury
- Pet accidents
- Power outage
- Information
- Directory assistance
- Injured or lost pet
- Abandoned vehicles Asking for directions
- Parking complaints
- Questions about tickets, warrants, court dates, etc.

Blocking the sidewalk is a violation of City Ordinance. You could be ticketed!

Definitions of Crime Types

Aggravated Assault — an attempt to cause serious bodily injury purposely.

Burglary — (breaking and entering) an unlawful entry into a building for the purposes of committing an offence. Usually that offence is theft.

Property Crime — destruction,

damage, vandalism

Rape — unlawful sexual activity carried out against the will of a male, female, or person under age, or incapable of consent.

Robbery — the taking of money or goods in the possession of another, from his or her person or immediate presence, by force or intimidation.

Theft — the act of stealing; the wrongful taking and carrying away of the personal goods or property of another; larceny. Examples include ransacking unlocked cars, taking property out of open garage doors, taking a purse off a front seat of an unlocked car, taking a mower out of the back of a pickup truck.

Dogs <u>MUST</u> be on a leash, or behind a <u>SECURE</u> fence. **The City** will issue a ticket; if that animal hurts someone, the owner may be sued by that individual.

Noticed garage sales too often? The state of Texas says you may have *two garage sales per year*. After two, the **IRS** wants you to report any money you make as income.

Have you seen a neighbor **parking their car in their yard?** This is against a City Ordinance – **HPD** can give them a **ticket!**

Did you notice a **vehicle that doesn't work** in a driveway, or parked in the street? Inoperable vehicles are a **ticketable** offense.

Do you have neighbors who play their music really loud after 10:00 at night? Let **HPD** know – call 311. Share the incident # with your neighbors so they may report this also.





PROOF OF RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

Photo Identification: Such as Texas Driver's license; Texas DPS issued I.D. card; or Texas License to Carry Permit.

AND ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

Utility Bill - A utility bill, power, water or gas, from the current month or previous two (2) months. The address on the utility bill must match the address on the state issued ID. Electronic bills are accepted.

Lease Agreement - If no utility bill is available, you may bring a copy of your current lease or rental agreement for a City of Houston address. The address on the lease or rental agreement must match the address on the state issued identification.

Yard waste must be placed in compostable bags at the curb by 7:00 am. on garbage collection day.

Bags bearing the City seal are no longer required. Place bags at least 3' from your garbage container. Yard waste includes grass clippings, leaves, and small branches. Filled bags must weigh under 50 pounds. Bundle small branches under 4 feet long and 18" in diameter and place them next to the bags.

Yard waste mixed with other materials will *not* be collected. Contractors must remove any waste they generate.
