DISTRICT J'S CORNER

Introducing J City: A New Approach to Community Services

As we enter 2025, District J will be rebranded as J City, a modern, community-focused district designed to deliver faster, more personalized services to residents. J City will operate like its own municipality, offering specialized programs tailored to address local needs with greater efficiency. These services will supplement standard city departments, ensuring quicker responses to community concerns. Each program will be funded through designated dollars from the district office, maximizing resources for the benefit of all J City residents.

The District J Patrol is a community policing initiative

launched in partnership with HPD to address low-level neighborhood crimes and violations. Residents can report issues directly at DistrictJPatrol.com for a faster, more transparent response. Personalized patrol vehicles will cover all areas of J City, focusing on proactive crime prevention and accountability.

The Supplemental Maintenance Team (SMT) is a dedicated crew responsible for weekly maintenance of right-of-ways, medians, vacant public lots, and accessible ditches throughout J City. Their work helps keep the community clean, safe, and well-maintained and safety.

The Beautification Team handles graffiti removal, debris clearing, and the disposal of illegal dumping. J City residents can report these issues for prompt attention, helping to maintain the district's appearance.

Animal Welfare Initiatives will provide resources for pet owners, including free medical treatments, pet food, and neighborhood sweeps for stray animals. These efforts will be supported by partnerships with the Houston Humane Society, BARC, Hope Clinic, and Pets for Life.

The Good Neighbor Program offers minor exterior home repairs for seniors, disabled residents, and military veterans living in J City. Requests for assistance can be made directly through the district office, ensuring vulnerable community members receive the help they need.

We are one of 11 districts in Houston, serving over 200,000 residents in a city nearly 700 square miles large—so vast that it could fit Chicago inside three times. It's challenging for city departments to respond to every issue as quickly as desired. However, you pay taxes and deserve reliable service and attention. That's why J City's programs were designed—to supplement city services and provide residents with the responsive care they deserve.

Did you know J City is the only district in Houston to receive these specialized programs and services? These unique initiatives ensure that residents receive faster and more effective service than the standard city offerings. Did you know the city of Houston spans nearly 700 square miles? The sheer size makes it difficult for city departments alone to serve every area as thoroughly as desired.

Did you know that District J is the only district in Houston to receive these specific specialized programs and services beyond the standard city services? These enhancements

provide faster, more effective solutions tailored specifically to the needs of the community.

Did you know that without these additional services, District J residents would only have access to the basic city services, which can be unpredictable and slow? The extra resources supplement standard city efforts, filling gaps and improving service delivery.

Did you know these specialized services make addressing issues more efficient and effective? By working alongside city departments, these services ensure a quicker response to local concerns.

Did you know council district offices have limited authority to control how city departments prioritize and respond to issues? Standard city services are often stretched thin, making it challenging to promptly address every neighborhood's unique needs.

Did you know the additional services provided by J City give District J more influence over service priorities? With independent service crews, the district office can respond faster and focus on community-specific issues.

Did you know that partnering with the Management Districts and TIRZs allows District J to stretch council office dollars further? These collaborations help fund additional services without burdening the city's budget. These specialized programs and services differentiate District J and are set up to be tailor-made for the needs of our area. As such, we will view our district like its own unique municipality, J City.

Need a copy of an accident report? Want to talk to an officer about a problem in your area? You see something suspicious and want to let law enforcement know about it? In Sharpstown, you won't have to go very far. Our community is served by two HPD substations, South Gessner and Midwest, and two HPD storefronts, Gulfton and Ranchester. The officers located at these facilities are there to help you in any way they can, so give them a call or a visit if you need assistance.

When to Call 911

(Generally Accepted Situations)

Definitions of Crime Types

Aggravated Assault — an attempt to cause serious bodily injury purposely.

Burglary — (breaking and entering) an unlawful entry into a building for the purposes of committing an offence. Usually that offence is theft.

Property Crime — destruction,

damage, vandalism

Rape — unlawful sexual activity carried out against the will of a male, female, or person under age, or incapable of consent.

Robbery — the taking of money or goods in the possession of another, from his or her person or immediate presence, by force or intimidation.

Theft — the act of stealing; the wrongful taking and carrying away of the personal goods or property of another; larceny. Examples include ransacking unlocked cars, taking property out of open garage doors, taking a purse off a front seat of an unlocked car, taking a mower out of the back of a pickup truck.

CLEAN WATER

55% of America's drinking water comes from forests.

FOOD

Without trees, we wouldn't have fruit, nuts, chocolate, or ice cream.

SHADE

Neighborhoods with trees are 7-10 degrees cooler than those without.

NOISE REDUCTION

Trees help absorb the sounds of traffic in urban areas by 40%.

National Arbor Day in 2025 is on the last Friday in April. However, the best time to plant trees in Houston is usually from mid-November to late-February. Some trees that grow well in Houston include: Nuttall Oak, Drake Elm, Mandarin Orange, Eastern Redbud, Southern Magnolia, and Mexican Fan Palm.

Houston, Texas urban forestry does enforce a tree protection ordinance. The City of Houston (COH) tree ordinance includes information about tree removal on private property and requirements for commercial properties.

The City of Houston Tree and Shrub Ordinance provides standards for planting trees and shrubs and installing landscaping buffers. The ordinance further protects Houston's greenery by offering incentives to property

owners who preserve and care for existing trees on private properties. Based on a property's size, the ordinance establishes minimum planting requirements for street trees, parking lot trees, shrubs and landscape buffers. These requirements ensure that Houston will have aesthetically pleasing developments and enhanced greenspace, making it a better place to live.

State law in Texas regulates tree removal and gives some county commissioners courts the power to restrict clear-cutting of live oak trees.

What Is a Deed Restricted Community? (or What Are Deed Restrictions?)

What is a deed restriction? It is a rule about what may be done to your property and how your property may be used. Deed restrictions are real and enforceable. Although there is only one sign posted in all Sharpstown, we *are* a deed restricted community.

When you purchased your home or property, you signed a Notice to Purchaser(s) stating that restrictions limit your use of the property. (You were also charged a one-time \$250 transfer fee, comparable to an HOA fee.) That form does not indicate what the deed restrictions are. Some restrictions are applicable to all the sections, and others are specific to the section where your property is located, in addition to the general restrictions. So *how* are you to know what these restrictions are and where to access this information?

To access the information, you will need to go to the Sharpstown Civic Association website at sharpstowncivic.org or simply search for *sharpstown civic association houston* on your browser. Once there you can find a link on the gray ribbon labeled *Deed Restrictions*. When you click on the link an explanation and summary of general restrictions for all sections appear.

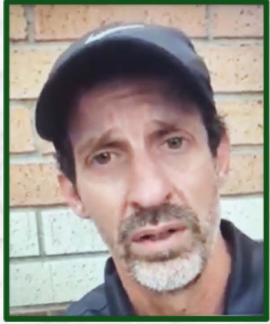

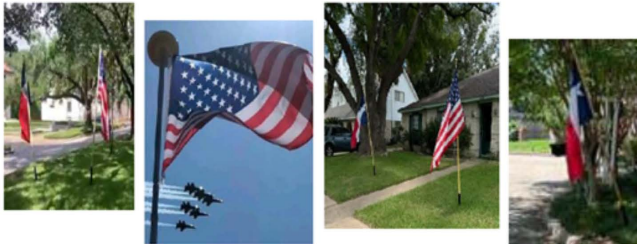

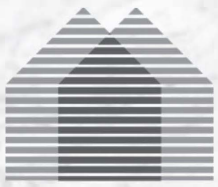
