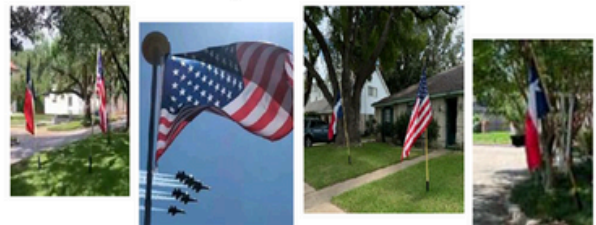

## DISTRICT J'S CORNER

### A Closer Look at Houston's Budget: Progress or Pause?



Our mayor has unveiled a \$7 billion budget for Houston, touting it balanced, without raising taxes (but I believe he will propose tax hikes soon) or introducing new fees. Houstonians should ask an important question: what does this budget mean for our daily lives?

The city's savings account, known as the general fund, was cut by \$107 million. This fund supports critical services that keep our neighborhoods safe, clean, and functioning.

Public Works has seen the largest monetary cut: \$21.8 million. The Department of Neighborhoods was slashed by nearly half. When funding for these essential services is gutted, it's hard to accept reassurances that city services will remain untouched. The reality is that less funding often means longer response times and fewer resources for the issues that matter most to our communities.

The city's Finance Director says if we continue balancing the budget by drawing from the city's fund balance Houston could face a \$500 million deficit within five years. The fund balance is not an endless well, and relying on it to patch holes today only digs a deeper one for tomorrow. We must change courses and explore new revenue options or structural reforms or risk a fiscal crisis that will be much harder to reverse.

We need new revenue streams or secure additional county or state funds. Department consolidations and voluntary retirements are cost-saving victories; however, they also mean fewer staff to handle our growing city's needs.

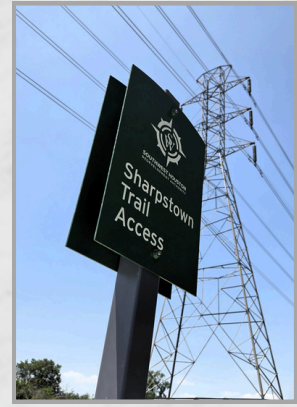
The mayor and council members need to work together, digging deeper into how we protect essential services while keeping our financial house in order. Houstonians deserve transparency and assurance that today's choices won't become tomorrow's challenges.

## Sharpstown Trail Access Nearing Completion

The new 1.8-mile trail connects Sands Point Drive to Beechnut Drive through the CenterPoint Energy easement, giving Sharpstown residents increased access to trails and greenspace! TIRZ 20 provided design funding, and TIRZ 20 and Harris County Precinct 4 funded the construction. Thanks to the City of Houston and CenterPoint agreement, trails within the easements are possible, Houston Parks Board served as the project manager and in coordination with the Sharpstown Civic Association, held community meetings to gather public input.

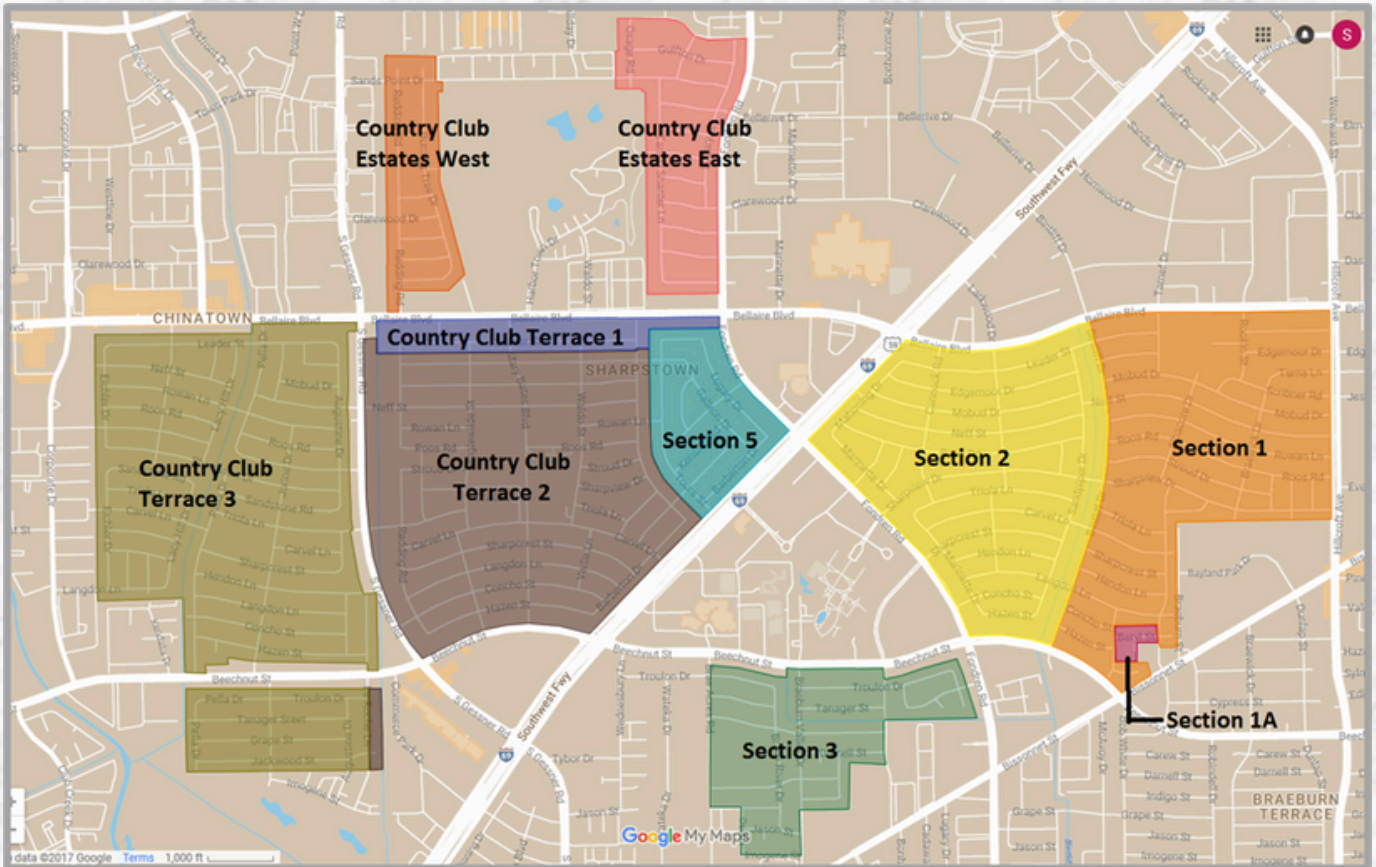

### Definitions of Crime Types

**Aggravated Assault** - an attempt to cause serious bodily injury purposely.

**Burglary** - (breaking and entering) an unlawful entry into a building for the purpose of committing an offence. Usually that offence is theft.

**Property Crime** - destruction, damage, vandalism

**Rape** - unlawful sexual activity carried out against the will of a male, female, or person under age, or incapable of consent.

**Robbery** - the taking of money or goods in the possession of another, from his or her person or immediate presence, by force or intimidation.

**Theft** - the act of stealing; the wrongful taking and carrying away of the personal good or property of another; larceny. Examples include ransacking unlocked cars, taking property out of open garage doors, taking a purse off a front seat of an unlocked car, taking a mower out of the back of a pickup truck.

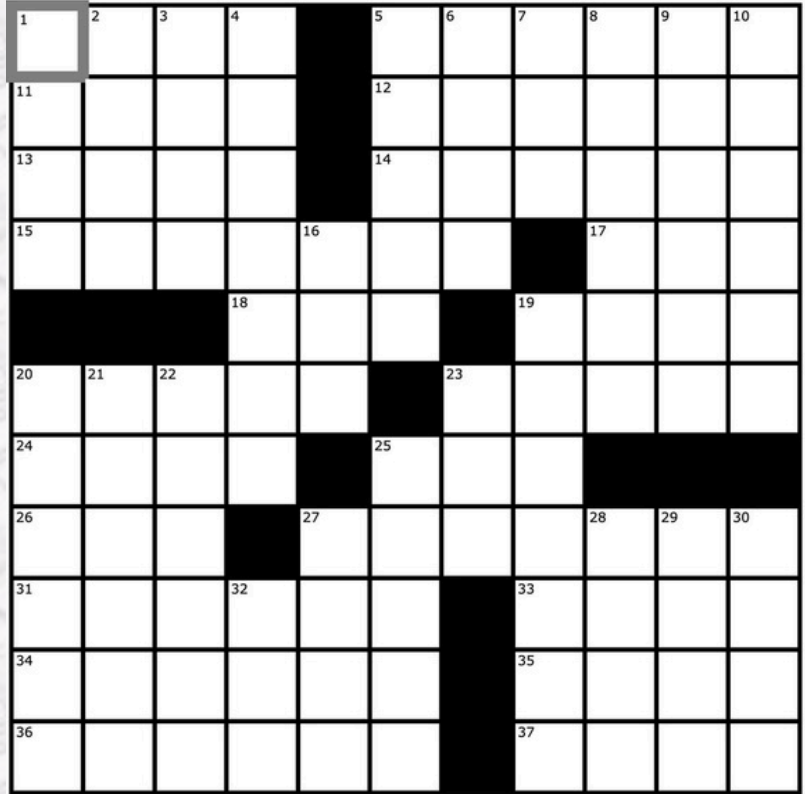

# 2024 SHARPSTOWN FOOTBALL BANQUET

Sharpstown High School celebrated its 2024 football team in the school's Commons during a banquet last Wednesday. I was honored to deliver the invocation at the banquet. The event was a special opportunity to recognize the young men and women who represented SHS with distinction last season: 33 letter winners and 7 superlative award recipients.

Led by new head coach Tre' Perro, SHS finished 3-7, recording victories over Kashmere (35-18), Scarborough (42-6) and Houston Austin (58-14). The Apollos fell to Madison, 23-20, on a walk-off field goal.

After a 0-10 2023 campaign, Sharpstown put together one of the state's biggest offensive turnarounds under the direction of Perro, his younger brother, Wynton, and former head coach Earl Westbrooks. Last season's squad outgained (2,857 yards to 400) and outscored (209-15) the 2023 edition by 714 and 1,393 percent, respectively. The defense forced 21 turnovers compared to five the previous fall.

## YARD WASTE

Yard Waste must be placed in compostable bags at the curb by 7:00 am on garbage collection day.

*Bags bearing the City seal are no longer required.*

- Place bags at least 3' from your garbage container.
- Yard waste includes grass clippings, leaves, and small branches.
- Filled bags must weigh under 50 pounds.
- Bundle small branches under 4' long and 18" in diameter and place them next to the bags.
- Yard waste mixed with other materials will not be collected.
- Contractors must remove any waste they generate.



### Tree Waste

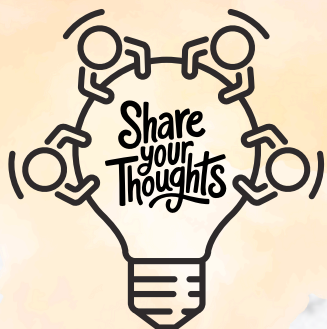
Tree waste is delayed as crews have been diverted to supplement recycling and heavy trash operations.

**Reminder:** If you hire a contractor to cut down trees, or lawn services, all waste created *must* be hauled away by the contractor, per ordinance.

Residents can also use any of the six neighborhood drop-off locations to dispose of their debris.

### Tire(s) Disposal

Residents may place up to four (4) tires at the curb for collection during Bulk Waste months. Collection crews will separate the tires from the Bulk Waste. It may take up to a week before crews return and retrieve the tires. Separating the tires from the rest of the Bulk Waste allows the SWMD to properly process tires.

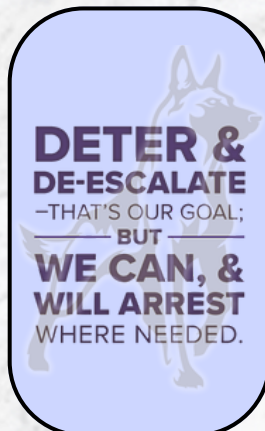
Need a copy of an accident report? Want to talk to an officer about a problem in your area? You see something suspicious and want to let Law Enforcement know about it?

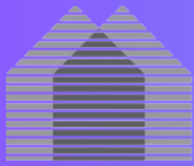
