- 1 Allow 3 feet between carts and structures such as mail boxes, lamp posts and 5 feet from cars
- 2 Face the metal bar toward the street
- 3 Make sure the lid is closed

Do not place cart underneath low, overhanging tree limbs or utility lines

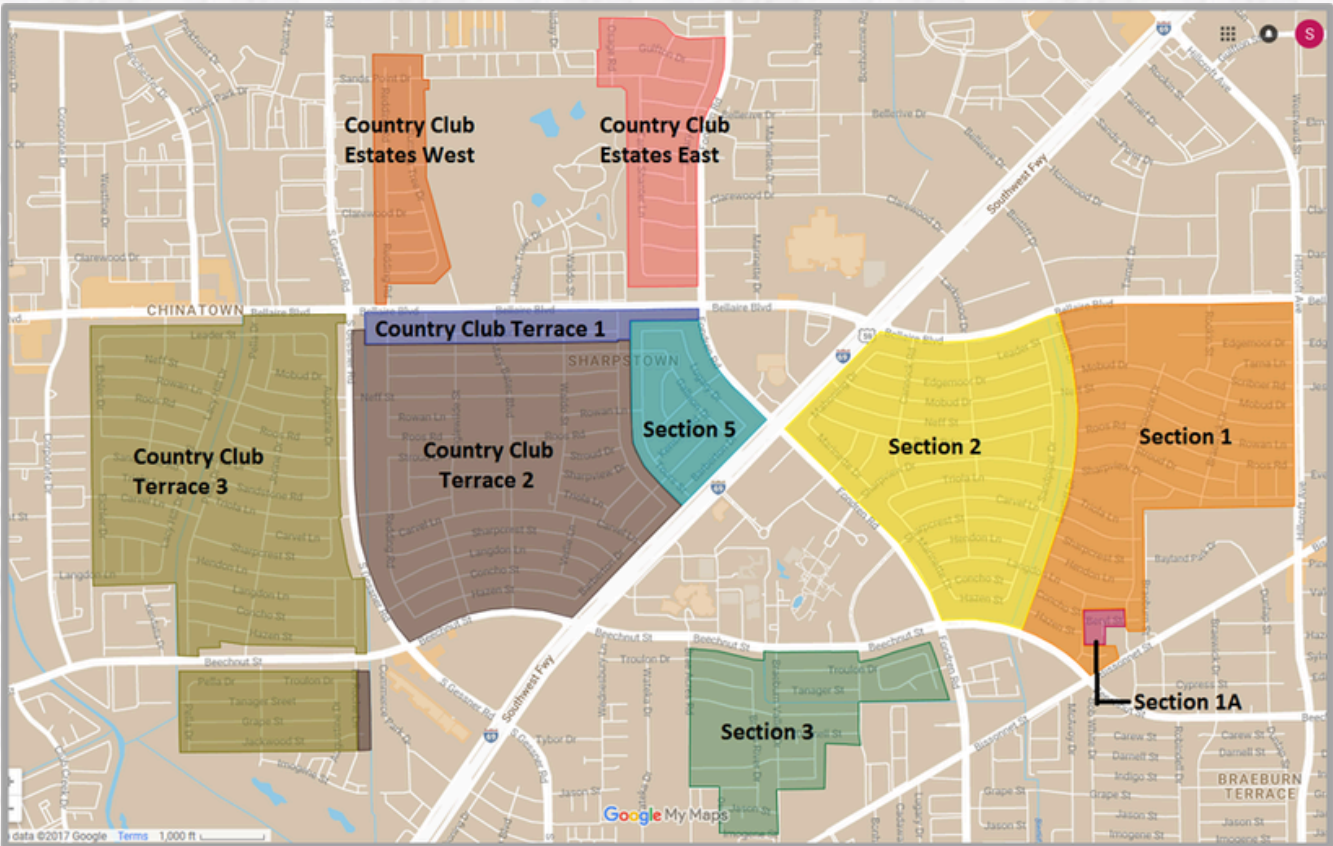

Definitions of Crime Types

Aggravated Assault - an attempt to cause serious bodily injury purposely.

Burglary - (breaking and entering) an unlawful entry into a building for the purpose of committing an offence. Usually, that offence is theft.

Property Crime - destruction, damage, vandalism

Rape - unlawful sexual activity carried out against the will of a male, female, or person under age, or incapable of consent.

Robbery - the taking of money or goods in the possession of another, from his or her person or immediate presence, by force or intimidation.

Theft - the act of stealing; the wrongful taking and carrying away of the personal good or property of another; larceny,. Examples include ransacking unlocked cars, taking property out of open garage doors, taking a purse off a front seat of an unlocked car, taking a mower out of the back of a pickup truck.

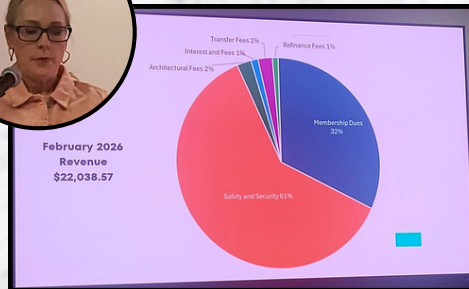

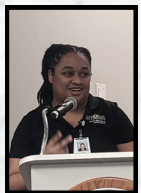

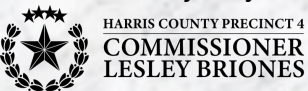

DISTRICT J'S CORNER

Addressing Recent Gunfire Incidents in the District

Over the past several weeks, many Sharpstown residents have reported gunfire in the neighborhood. No injuries have been documented, but these incidents have understandably generated concern. The District J office has responded with proactive measures, reaffirming its commitment to the safety and well-being of all Sharpstown residents.

The District J office found that inadequate lighting contributed to incidents in several areas. Solar-powered lighting fixtures have since been installed at these sites. Better illumination is a cost-effective deterrent to crime and a meaningful investment in neighborhood security.

To further reinforce deterrence,

signage has been placed in select areas. These signs notify the public that surveillance measures are in effect. They serve as visible indicators to discourage unlawful conduct before it occurs.

In addition, the District J office is working closely with the Houston Police Department. Investigators have active leads, and efforts continue. While specifics cannot be disclosed at this time, law enforcement is focused on identifying and holding those responsible accountable.

Community engagement remains indispensable for public safety. Sharpstown residents are strongly encouraged to report incidents and

suspicious activity by calling 911 in emergencies, contacting HPD's non-emergency line at 713-884-3131, or submitting reports online. Each report provides valuable data that helps the District J office identify patterns, allocate resources, and determine where additional safety improvements, such as more lighting, may be needed.

Through this organized approach, the District J office remains committed to keeping Sharpstown safe and maintaining the quality of life residents deserve.

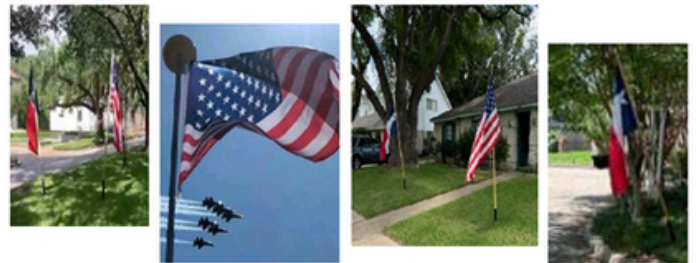

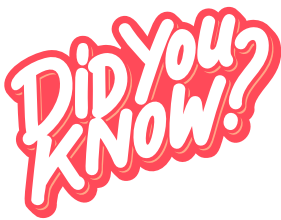

FIREWORKS ARE ILLEGAL?

The use of fireworks are not only **ILLEGAL** in the City and parts of the County but they are also are very dangerous.

It is illegal to discharge fireworks the City of Houston. A Texas House Bill allows for the transportation of fireworks, however there are restrictions including where the fireworks are located inside the vehicle and if they are opened or unopened.

The City will continue to enforce, in compliance with state law, fire and safety regulations within the city. Harris County residents should also be aware that HFD will be enforcing the fireworks ban in the Limited Purpose Annexation Areas.

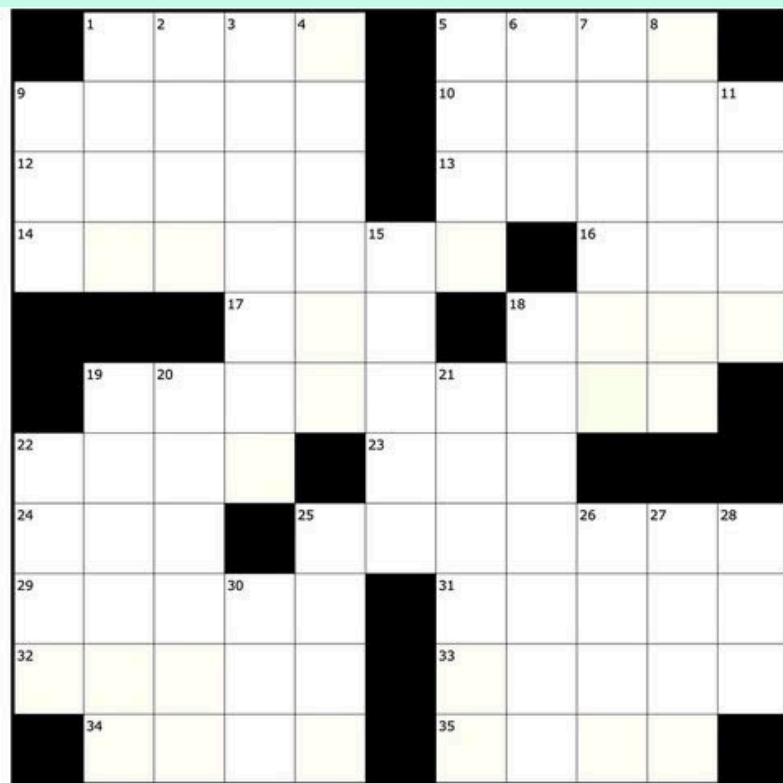
